Help us preserve, distribute and archive our materials. Please let us know if you have contacts who could help us with this.


Reindeer Antler Carving

We buy antler amulets and carvings from the Dukha reindeer herders who have gathered them from the forest floor after the reindeer drop them naturally and carved them by hand. The herders use the income for rice and flour. When we sell them, 100% of the funds go to Nomadicare.


